Commodore's Ball - Pelican Isle Yacht Club

The Commodore's Ball is an annual gala dinner-dance held in honor of the current Commodore. The "ball" is a purely social function and the program, if any, should be kept to an absolute minimum.

Uniforms

Current flag officers and all past commodores will wear their formal uniform as outlined in "Yacht Club Attire and Insignia".

Entrance March (Grand March)

The Commodore's Ball shall begin with a formal entrance or "Grand March" of officers and spouses. This is an opportunity for the members to recognize and thank the people who are responsible for the Club for the year. Current flag officers and spouses gather in the front hall in reverse order of precedents. The line is arranged as follows:

Rear Commodore, Vice Commodore, Commodore

All caps are carried under the left arm. Women regardless whether in uniform or not are on the right arm of the men.
